

Pupil Premium Impact Report 2013-14

This report demonstrates the achievement of Free School Meal Students between 2013 and 2014. The attainment table shows the proportion of students who achieved level 5 or more in English and Maths by the end of Year 9. The progress table shows the points of progress made by students during Key Stage 3.

These results show that although our FSM students were 20% behind non-FSM students in terms of the percentage of students who gained level 5 in English, they were only 1.3 points behind non-FSM students in terms of progress in English. The gap was narrowed from 25% to 20% and the progress gap was halved from 2.2 points to 1.3 points in 2014.

In Maths the 2014 results showed that the gap had widened in terms of attainment and progress. Since then we have evaluated the strategies used during the last three academic years and developed our provision for Pupil Premium students for 2014-2015. Our action plan, including how much money will be spent and the intended impact can be found on the school website under 'School Information' and 'Pupil Premium'.

Predictions for 2015 suggest we are on course to significantly narrow the gap in English and Maths by the end of this year for the current Year 9 cohort.
